This provides significant opportunities to divert organic waste from landfills and reduce carbon emissions across the wider Canterbury region. The renewable energy produced will help Christchurch industry decarbonise through local options for sustainable fuel.

Ecogas also looks forward to working with Canterbury farmers by providing a locally produced biofertiliser that can replace imported synthetic fertilisers and has been proven to be effective on Waikato dairy farms.
